

600yd Range Occupation Steps

This guide is meant to supplement information received at the High Power range orientation. Range orientations are conducted after each match concluding at the 600/1000 firing line. A High Power range orientation must be completed before using the High Power range.

Before occupying a firing position or going down range for any reason, several precautions must be taken to ensure safe conditions. Follow the below safety procedures:

1. Go to the 600/1000yd firing line and observe down range. Look for the flashing red lights under the firing line cover, flags flying, targets up, vehicles and personnel, indicating that the range is occupied. If the range is occupied, feel free to go down range and coordinate with the others on the range for shooting, the red strobe should already be on and signs and flag should already be up, but if not, proceed to step two.

Note: If the red "Bravo Flag" (Red) is posted to the left of the 600yd impact berm, there is likely someone downrange between the 600yd butts and the 1000yd berm.

2. Turn on red strobe lights under the firing line cover indicating the firing line is closed and personnel are downrange.

3. Post the safety sign on the road warning approaching personnel that the range is in use. Simply stand the sign up at the intersection of the main road and the road to the butts(pits).

4. Drop the placard on the medal real estate type sign indicating that the range is in use.

5. While on the way to the butts, observe each firing line and the range in total to ensure the area is not occupied.

6. Run the wind flag (Red and Yellow) up the 200yd line flag-pole to signal that the range is in use.

7. Proceed to the butts area to make sure the area is unoccupied.

8. Set up a traditional target or ShotMarker electronic target (see ShotMarker instructions on web page).

Note: While using the 600/1000yd firing line you may turn the red strobe lights off, but make sure the lights are turned back on before going back down range or leaving the firing line for any reason.

9. Reverse these actions when firing is complete, as you leave the range.
