

1000yd Range Occupation Steps

This guide is meant to supplement information received at the High Power range orientation. Range orientations are conducted after each match concluding at the 600/1000yd line. A range orientation must be completed before using the High Power range. Range rules are listed behind the 1000/600yd firing line – review these rules if its been a while since your orientation, and make sure your guests understand these rules before range use.

Before occupying a firing position or going down range for any reason, several precautions must be taken to ensure safe conditions.

1. Open the 600yd range as per 600yd Range Occupation Steps as documented on the OKCGC web page.
2. Unlock the 1000yd gate and proceed to the “Bravo Flag” pole on the left side of the 600yd berm. Run the red “Bravo Flag” up indicating that the 1000yd range is occupied. This flag is REQUIRED when using the 1000yd range.
3. It's important to drive a vehicle rather than walking to the 1000 as it's much easier to see a vehicle than it is a person at 1000yds. Think SAFETY – Safety – safety.
4. Unlock and face steel targets to the firing line and or set up an electronic target (See ShotMarker instructions). No personal targets may be used whatsoever, paper or steel, you may use only targets provided.

Note: While using the 600/1000yd firing line you may turn the red strobe lights off, but make sure the lights are turned back on before going back down range or leaving the firing line for any reason.

5. All other high power range rules must be followed.
6. Reverse these actions when firing is complete as you leave the range.

Note: NEVER leave a target up or in the case of steel targets, NEVER leave targets faced to the firing line, or a dangerous condition may result. We want to eliminate the chance of an untrained member, guest, or trespasser rolling up to a seemingly unoccupied range with a target posted and start shooting without checking down range for personnel. Always remember that personnel could be down range that you can't see from the 1000/600yd line which is why we must always physically check down range before firing.
