

Bullseye/Precision Pistol range construction update

If you have been to the club in the last month or so you likely have noticed some major construction activity taking place at the bullseye pistol range directly north of the main clubhouse. The bullseye range was originally constructed in the early 1960's and until now remained largely unchanged.

After almost 60 years of continuous service the Board determined it was time for a nearly complete reconstruction of the range. The rear berm will be completely rebuilt, and a new concrete wall added to the west side of the range. Where the turning targets at 25 yards were previously protected by a low earthen berm, the new 25 yard turning targets will be located below ground inside a concrete trench. A steel plate will cover the trench when not in use. By removing the 25-yard berm and creating a relatively flat range floor the new range will be capable of hosting a wider variety of activities including (but not limited to) additional training opportunities.



The old, fixed target holders at 50 yards will be replaced with new fixed target holders. In addition, to facilitate wider use of the range, a concrete surface approximately [15] yards deep and extending the full width of the bay will be added near the north berm to allow the range to be used for close range activities when otherwise it would be too muddy. The existing firing line and cover will remain in place with only minor modifications to accommodate the spacing of the new target system(s). We anticipate the new range will contain approximately the same number of shooting lanes as the old.



The target date for re-opening of the range is April 1, 2021 (weather permitting). We believe these improvements will further position the Oklahoma City Gun Club to provide more opportunities within the community for the next 60 years.
