Fullbore – International Style Rifle Shooting in the Heart of America

“Fullbore” is a rifle discipline, the big brother to a discipline much more familiar to many of us here in the USA, Smallbore Rifle. While smallbore consists of the precision disciplines shooting a .22LR at ranges out to 200yds, Fullbore is shot with a high power rifle at much greater distances.

Fullbore is “high power rifle competition” wherein the caliber is limited to .308 Win/7.62x51 or .223 Rem/5.56x45. Projectiles are also restricted to no heavier than 156 grains for the .308, or 91 grains for the .223. This is not a “gun race” as no competitor has a significant ballistics advantage over the other. It’s shot on paper targets at ranges of 300, 500, 600, 900, and 1000 yards. It’s shot slow fire, which means one round at a time with the target “pulled and marked” after each shot.

Fullbore is shot in the prone position, with only the support of a sling and shooting jacket. Optical sights are not allowed - so open sights only. It’s just as much a test of true marksmanship ability as smallbore,

but distances make conditions (wind and light) much more a factor. The ranges on which Fullbore is shot have firing lines at the requisite distances with firing points at least 8 feet wide to accommodate up to three shooters per target. Three shooters “to the mound” is the norm internationally, but here in the US two to the mound is more common.

When shooting “two to the mound”, the shooter on the right fires first while the shooter on the left scores, meaning uses a spotting scope to see the spotted shot on the target. Pulled and marked by people in the target area – targets are “pulled” into a pit area below the line of sight with shots marked with a cardboard disc or spotter, then run back up so shooters and scorers can evaluate the hit. Once the shooter on the right has accepted the score for the shot, the shooter on the left has

45 seconds to shoot while the shooter on the right scores. This rotation continues until firing is complete, 45 seconds per shot - then the relay of shooters moves to the next firing line: 500yds,

600yds, etc. and shooting continues. Of course, electronic targets eliminate the need for pit pullers and scorers spotting shots with scopes, but this does not change the way the match is conducted.

Most fullbore matches in the USA consist of 2 sighting shots and 15 shots for record at four distances, but this varies widely on the international scene. Sighting shots are “convertible” meaning they can count for score if the shooter wants them, but there are limitations: A shooter can take the first and second sighter, or just the second, but not only the first excluding the second – a little confusing, I know.

Fullbore's multiple shooters to the mound contrasts with “string firing” which is much more common in mid-range and long-range shooting here in the USA. When string firing, one shooter engages the target one shot at a time while a scorekeeper keeps track until the shooting is done (most normally 20 shots for record), then the shooter and scorer switch places. The greatest distinction between the two methods is that when the wind becomes a factor (and it does!), shooters firing two to the mound can't simply make sight adjustments for wind based upon their last shot (something we call “chasing the spotter”), or simply wait on a favorable condition, because during the time required for the other shooter to fire and record shots, the conditions inevitably change, forcing each shooter to evaluate and correct

for conditions each time they fire. Three shooters to the mound adds time more between each individual's shots thus adding to the difficulty, not to mention the additional fatigue which comes with the extra time in position.

In recent years Fullbore matches have been opened up to shooters firing from bipods with optics but the caliber restrictions remain enforced. At the OKCGC, in order to encourage participation, we allow these rifle types and also sling shooters opting to use various calibers and optics.

The International Confederation of Fullbore Rifle Associations, ICFRA, regulates fullbore competition worldwide, with each country's NRA appointing a representative. There are about 43 ICFRA countries. This is a pretty big deal internationally!

The Oklahoma City Gun Club (OKCGC) conducts several fullbore matches each year and a league meets here once a week from the beginning of March to the end of September. The OKCGC is the only venue in the state capable of holding these matches. Observers and competitors are welcome and encouraged. July 2026 Construction Update

In January the Board approved funding to continue modernizing the berms on the Action Shooting ranges—these are the six north most bays on Hiwassee Road north of the Shotgun facility. Our target for 2026 was to complete the remaining northern bays. In mid-May, when I prepared the last construction update, I thought the project would be completed in June. Well, my optimism did not pan out as planned because the principal piece of equipment used by the contractor to harvest dirt for the berm broke and its repair took longer than expected, but it is now fixed. I am in close contact with the contractor and have been told work will resume shortly after the July 4th holiday if not a little before. I am told there are only about 7-10 days of work remaining before we are complete. If true, this will complete the rear impact berm project which began with the muzzleloading berm in 2023, and the cowboy action berm in 2024 and 2025. We appreciate your patience during the construction and the associated range closures.

Members are reminded that on all ranges bullets must impact the berms and never the floor of any range. When using the cowboy and action shooting bays please place targets at the bottom of the berms. If you want to shoot the targets from a closer position, just go downrange. You are not required to shoot from the covered portion (for those bays with covers). This ensures that all bullets impact the berms.

Please be patient and as always be sure to check the club calendar for scheduled events as well as construction closures before you come to the facility. We have a lot going on at the club, and we know it is frustrating to arrive and find out there are construction closures, workday projects, or other scheduled activities.

In addition to the berm project, you will soon see a new electric gate being installed at the Cowboy entrance. The project is being funded by a combination of a generous donation from a club member (who wishes to remain anonymous), funds from the divisions that use that gate (primarily action pistol and the cowboy division), and funds from the main club. I have designed the gate to be identical to the main gate, and it will allow large vehicles to be fully off Hiwassee road before stopping to enter a code. The gate controller will also be capable of enhanced functionality that we can use to test things such as temporary gate codes, and possibly member specific RFID badges. Hopefully the contractor will have the gate installed before the end of July.

5-Stand Range

The 5-Stand range is located on the north end of the gun club. You will enter through the Cowboy Action gate (Gate 3) off Hiwassee, then left, following the signs to 5-Stand, going past Smallbore/Air gun and Muzzleloader Ranges.

5-Stand blends skeet, trap, and sporting clays into one range with very little walking or movement. 5-Stand simulates real-world bird hunting with machines launching different-sized clays from multiple locations, angles, and speeds.

There are 5 shooting windows in which the shooter will see 25 total clays from up to eight different machines and directions. At each window, shooters will see 5 clays, shooting a single, a report pair, and a true pair. Once shooting for that window is complete, the shooter moves one window to their right and shoots again. The overall order is for a window to shoot the single, then the next window will shoot their single, and so on until everyone has shot the 5 above-mentioned clay order.

The shooting order, the menu card, will be listed on a small board in front of each station and will coincide with the numbered orange cones by each machine on the field. This enables the shooter to see where the clay will fly from. The machines are set up from easy to difficult flight patterns. Enabling novice to expert shooters to enjoy the range.

Currently, OKC Gun Club 5-Stand has 11 machines and offers 4 types of clay. The rabbit that typically runs along the ground. The midi is 3 ½" wide, harder to see, and will fly faster. A Battue clay is a wafer-thin clay that flies in fast loops, and a typical 4 ¼" clay. All the clays have orange tops and black bottoms.

5-Stand is a shotgun sport, where shooters can use any gauge of shotgun. Typically, shooters use 12 or 20 gauges. Typical loads use 1-ounce or 1-1/8-ounce shot of #7.5 or #8 sizes, Lead shot only – NO steel.

In 2025, 5-Stand began offering a league option: several months each year, shooting on Mondays or Tuesdays, along with the scheduled monthly shoots, typically on the third Sunday of the month. The leagues and monthly shoots are open to club and non-club members. League dates are advertised on the Facebook page and via email. The June league is ongoing with 47 shooters and wraps up the last Monday/Tuesday of June. The next league opportunities will be in September, October, or November.

As with any range at the Oklahoma City Gun Club, shooters will need eye and ear protection while on the range. So come on out and shoot a couple rounds of 5-Stand.
