## The Value of a Workday

As forecasted temperatures began to decline, I started trying to chip away at the High Power Division director's resolve, urging him to reschedule the work day that was to take place the upcoming weekend. My reasoning was simple: Of

the twenty something members who had volunteered to work, the majority were going to cancel, and there will be more time spent standing around a burn barrel trying to keep warm than working. The day was to start out in the low double digits and move slowly to a high in the upper twenties. It was going to be miserable – we would have to schedule another workday anyway to get the work done that we had planned.

Five-stand was canceled, then the Shotgun Honors training that weekend was canceled, but Director Kent Shomber was not deterred.

The thermometer on my truck read 12 degrees when I pulled through the main gate, chainsaw and bladed weed-eater in my truck's bed, Carhartts in the back seat. This was going to be a miserable wasted day.

When I made the corner and approached the High Power club house, my predictions began to play out. There were only a few vehicles parked around. I walked into the club house and there was

only a hand full of guys, most of whom I'd never seen before, and a couple of club officials, not many conversations. This was going to suck. I let the director know I'd be working in the target pit today, cutting the saplings, green brier, and sumac off the 600yd impact berm. I begrudgingly made my way down range and got to work.

30 minutes later I trudged back to my tailgate for some more two cycle fuel, and you imagine my surprise at the sight of fifteen or more trucks between the 400 and 500 yard lines, and workers, with the urgency of ants, cutting trees, and dragging brush. Were they having a good time?! I went back to my work in the pit, somewhat confused.

In another couple of hours my work in the pit was nearing its end and five or so of the volunteers showed up to cheerfully drag away all the cut brush I had created. Are you kidding me? Cheerful? It may have been 22 degrees out!

We were all but done when someone walked into the pit and announced it

was time for lunch. Instead of everyone dropping what they were doing for the cook's reprieve, they stayed at it for another fifteen minutes, completing the job. What was motivating these lunatics?!

After a hot bowl of some of the best deer chili I had ever eaten and some pleasant conversation with some new friends in the warmth of the club house, we all went back to work conquering a tree line. Without exception everyone was engaged, smiles on faces, pulling in the same direction to get the job done. There was talk of shooting, hunting, family, and everybody there was making new friends. I was being taught a lesson I had long forgotten: that adversity creates bonds that far outlast hardships.

As workday cards were being signed, and goodbyes were being said, it struck me that the workdays create friendships, something worth far more than an \$80 dues credit, and perhaps the most valuable benefit of being a part of the OKC Gun Club.

# Wildfire Abatement Division

During the OKCGC February Board meeting, vice president, Mark Vaughan, initiated the new Wildfire Abatement Division to provide guidance to Division leadership for minimizing the risk of wildfire, reduce property damage, and ensure Club members' safety. The newly formed team had their first organizational meeting and developed the Fire Safety Plan to implement the first stages of abatement. Zone One clearance (0'-10') around buildings, improvements and infrastructure is the priority. The following priorities will be Zone Two (10'-30') and Zone Three (30'-200') with scaled reduction of fuel density. Bill Thompson will chair the group, with Bryan Wilkerson as Co-Chair. Assisting them will be Tom Peace, Chris Alexander, Kent Shomber and Danny Grounds.

Watch for an announcement of volunteer opportunities in the near future.

# 2026 Construction Update

On January 7, 2026, the Board approved funding to continue modernizing the berms on the Action Shooting ranges—these are the six bays on Hiwassee Road north of the Shotgun facility. Last year, we finished rebuilding the rear impact berms on the northern cowboy bays, but since this project is large, it will take several years to finish. Our target for 2026 is to complete the remaining northern bays. While construction happens, which includes raising the berms higher, all six north Action Shooting bays will be closed Monday through Friday; however, they should stay open on weekends.

Members will still have access to other bays (especially the southern bays, where work is already done) during the week, though some rolling closures will occur as construction progresses north. Some Cowboy bays may also need to close temporarily. We expect these closures

will last through March and possibly into April. For your safety, please avoid the construction area and do not disturb the crew at work.

Please be patient and as always be sure to check the club calendar before you come to the facility for scheduled events as well as construction closures. We have a lot going on at the club, and we know it is frustrating to arrive and find out there are construction closures, or scheduled activities.


