LAND RUN 2025 THE SASS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS OF COWBOY ACTION & WILD BUNCH SHOOTING

On October 4th, the range was ready and so were we, thanks to all of the hard work done by our OKC Gun Club members and volunteers. Our match started with the SASS Wild Bunch National Championship on Saturday, October 4th. We had 109 shooters, which set a new record.

Congratulations to our Wild Bunch Match Director Jere Korthanke (AKA Roy's Creek Dan) for a fun and challenging match. Our top shooters from the OKC Gun Club were Tyler Meade (AKA Marshal Shorty) who finished 4th in the Open Division, and Melody Hile (AKA Missouri Mae) who finished 4th in the Ladies Division. The OKC Gun Club was well represented in the Open Senior Division by James Fox (AKA Shootin Fox) who finished 2nd, and Jere Korthanke (AKA Roy's Creek Dan) who finished 7th. We closed out The Wild Bunch Match with a BBQ Dinner and plenty of praise for our match.

The following Tuesday and Wednesday were full days with side matches and warm-up matches.

The opening ceremony was held at The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum on Wednesday evening, where over 400 people enjoyed appetizers and toured the museum.

Match director, Melody Hile, had written 12 stages for the main match that were fast and interesting. With three flights per day on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, we were able to avoid any serious issues and were able to complete the match in record time.

We wrapped up the eight full days of shooting and fun with the awards banquet at The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum, which was attended by 850 shooters and their guests.

You may have noticed some new signs at the entrances of the club. These are meant to reaffirm to all “non-members” that we are a private club. The following information will be part of the next Members Guide and should be adhered to. If there are any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact a club official.



Rule #1. This range and associated facilities are for the use of OKLAHOMA CITY GUN CLUB members and their guests only. Members must wear their membership badges at all times while at the range. If you lose your membership badge, request a

replacement by contacting membership@okcgunclub.org.

To deter non-club members from entering through an open gate and using the club at their leisure, the board has posted “no trespassing” signs at all entrances, a requirement for the prosecution of trespassers.

Please offer gentle reminders to your club mates to wear their badges prominently, and don’t be reluctant to ask a stranger at the club to see his or her badge if not being worn. While we welcome non-members to participate in many of our matches and events, they must remain in the area of the activity while on our property. Non-members are not familiar with our rules and could pose a safety or security risk.

If anyone not wearing a badge offers any resistance when confronted, discretely get a picture of their license plate, and forward the picture, with time, place and other pertinent information to any board member. Non-compliant members will have the opportunity to explain their actions at a board meeting, and non-members will be contacted by police.

Thank you for helping make the OKLAHOMA CITY GUN CLUB a safer place for our members and communities.

Thanks to all the shooters who have supported this challenging match for several years. The season is officially over for 2025; however, most of the shooters have requested having a match over the winter, weather cooperating. We came up with the following: Match on the SECOND SATURDAY of the month with two important changes. The match will start at 010:00, IF the weather report calls for a temperature of 45 degrees or higher at the same 010:00. As usual we are shooting on the Smallbore/ Airgun range on the east side of the club property, enter at the Cowboy gate and bear left.

This simple/challenging game works like this: 22LR rifles shot at 100 yards for score. Single feeding of ammunition or single load magazines. Bipods and machine rests allowed on the front of the rifle and sandbags on the rear. If you have an accurate rifle bring it out and see how good it and you can be in competition. If you are curious we have club rifles set up ready to play; come give it a try you might get hooked!

Rimfire Sporter Rifle

Being inexpensive to shoot and easy to handle, the .22 Long Rifle may be the most popular small caliber rifle in America. Most people with shooting backgrounds tracing back to their youth started out with one of these guns. My first rifle was the popular Ruger 10/22, a slick semiautomatic that was fun to shoot, something of a 15-year old's dream! This rifle was my companion on many trips to the field and woods to hunt rabbits and squirrels – most of my quarry was safer than I had hoped, but it was a true test of skill, something of which I summarily lacked.

To draw people to the shooting sports, a number of years ago the Civilian Marksmanship Program came up with the Rimfire Sporter Rifle Match. These matches are a great way for people of all ages to get started with “three position shooting”. A wide variety of rifles may be used with courses of fire modified for both bolt action and semi-automatic versions, scoped or open sighted. No special equipment is required beyond a rifle with a 5-round capacity.

The first time I shot this match, I attended with several of my shooting buddies, all of whom were seasoned High Power Rifle competitors with expansive knowledge of position shooting. As you might imagine, we made quite the pageant of it all, with plenty of pre-match game talking. We all shot .22s we had for years, unmodified, nothing special. I recall that I had a “jam” in one of the rapid-fire strings, costing me 10 points and moving me out of the winner's circle which added to the fun. We had a great time. I sure do wish I was shooting that Ruger I carried all those years ago, traded away for “something better” in my years of very limited resources. Had I only known.

This match is designed to be a fun way to develop marksmanship skills with a minimum of specialized equipment. “Three Position” refers to the Standing, Sitting or Kneeling, and Prone positions, all of which are used during this 6-stage event.

The first four stages are conducted at the fifty-yard line, but before the competition begins, everyone is given 5 minutes for unlimited sighting shots.

The match starts with “slow fire Prone” wherein a tough little target is engaged with ten record shots in a time limit of 10 minutes. This gives the competitor plenty of time to reload lower capacity rifles and make sight adjustments to refine zeroes. Competitors reload as necessary to complete the ten-shot string.

Next comes “Rapid fire Prone”, 10 shots for record, which is conducted in two strings of 5 rounds each, in a time limit of 25 or 30 seconds per string, depending on the type of rifle, semiautomatic vs. manually operated. Notice that this is where the rifle being capable of firing 5 shots in succession is important.

“Slow Fire Sitting or Kneeling” is the next stage. Same course of fire as the prone slow fire event. Total time limit of 10 minutes.

The final stage fired at the 50 yard line is “Rapid Fire Sitting or Kneeling”, which is conducted just as was the prone rapid-fire event: Two strings of fire, five shots each, with a time limit of 25 or 30 seconds per string.

Next, shooters advance to the 25-yard line for the Standing events.

First is “Standing Slow Fire” which is conducted just as were the other slow fire events. 10 shots for record in a time limit of 10 minutes, reloading as required.

The final stage is “Rapid Fire Standing” conducted just as were the other rapid-fire stages: Two strings of 5 record shots each in a time limit of 25 or 30 seconds.

You can probably recognize that this match moves from the least difficult position, Prone, to the most difficult, Standing, so shooters are able to build confidence along the way.

Being a Civilian Marksmanship “Games” event, this match awards “Achievement Pins” in Gold, Silver, and Bronze depending on the score fired, and even has its place in our national CMP Games matches.

Rimfire Sporter is truly a “Beginners Match”, so everything is well explained before the shooting starts with plenty of reinforcement as the match is conducted. It's always a good idea to arrive early to your first match and find an official, or the match director. Explain you're a first timer and he or she will likely marry you up with an experienced shooter who can explain things in detail and put you under their wing for the day: Something you'll appreciate. I've never been involved in a shooting sport where there weren't people willing, even wanting to help.

The Oklahoma City Gun Club offers Rimfire Sporter matches, “CMP Sporter Rifle” under the Smallbore division run by Jim Durham. You can find Jim's contact information on the club web site under “Divisions and Contacts”, then “Smallbore”. The match is \$15 for non-members, \$10 for members, and \$3 for those under 18.

The next match is at 9:00 a.m. Saturday, November 1. Now get out there and have some fun!
